PE and Sports Grant Funding

The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015, 2015 to 2016, 2016 to 2017 and 2017-18 to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and has been allocated to Primary School Headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Howes Community Primary School decided to use the money to:

- employ coaching support for our teachers from Nursery through to Year 6 to work together to plan and teach units of work.
- support and engage the least active children in physical activities
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- provide places for pupils in before and after school sports clubs
- improve resources to support the development of the subject

The impact of the use of the grant will be reviewed at the end of each year.
